1. As the world is finally waking up to the challenges of climate change, green groups are getting involved in finding the practical solutions that will save the planet. But how interested are very young people in these most important issues? According to a recent survey by the Department for Environment, only half of 11- to 17-year-olds in the UK claim to be worried about climate change. Only 12% of that age group said they were capable of making a positive impact by changing their own lifestyles. Could it be that updating their MySpace and Facebook profile is more urgent than saving the planet? Let's look at how a number of groups are now trying to engage teenagers in the climate-change debate.

2. Next month, the *Live Earth* concert will see musicians - including Madonna, Snow Patrol and the Black Eyed Peas - trying to raise awareness in a 24-hour music marathon taking place over seven continents. At the same time, a somewhat smaller event will be sending the same message on Clapham Common in south London at the *Party for the Planet*. The party which is organised by C-Change, a youth environmental forum, aims to encourage those already alerted to climate change to help raise awareness among their peers. The event will feature a low-carbon eco-village filled with interactive installations, information tents and games. It will also host the final of the *Battle of the Bands* competition, with the winner given the chance to use a solar-powered studio.

3. C-Change is also planning a number of projects for the rest of the year, including club nights and a youth radio station. At the Glastonbury festival, C-Change, in collaboration with the Centre for Alternative Technology, launched *Climate:Mobile*, a mobile-phone application that calculates your carbon footprint. *Operation: Climate Control*, another digital product aimed at teenagers, will be launched next week where players are set the challenge of making decisions that will stop climate change.
